
## **Botany Department Activities (2022-2023)**

Industrial Visit to Cooperative Sugar Mill, Karnal: An industrial visit to Cooperative Sugar Mill, Karnal was organized by the department for B.Sc. III students on February 14, 2023. Students studied about sugar production process, electricity generation through bagasse and pollution control measures adopted by the Mill. Sh. Bhajan Lal (Deputy Chief Engineer, Sugar Mill), Arun Saxena (Production Engineer, Sugar Mill) and Vikas Sangwan (Security Head, Sugar Mill), explained about the whole process to our students there.





An Exposure Visit to Centre for Excellence of Vegetables (CEV), Gharaunda: was organized for students of B.Sc. II (Medical and Biotechnology) by department of Botany on February 15, 2022. During this visit, general orientation of students was done by Dr. Pramod, Subject Matter Specialist, CEV. He discussed about various CEV mandates, advanced agricultural techniques *viz.* vertical farming, organic farming, drip irrigation system, soil-less media and their benefits for farmers with them. He also motivated them to pursue careers in this field. Dr. Pramod also demonstrated them about HiTech Nursery at the centre. He interacted with the students and enlightened them about Mulching, Low Tunnels, Anti-insect Nets, Walk-in Tunnels, and Naturally Ventilated Polyhouse. Dr. Deepak showed them automated drip irrigation system and guided them about organic manure preparation and organic farming. Our students also collected weeds for herbarium preparation from CEV premises.





Three-Day Interdisciplinary Training Workshop on Mushroom Cultivation was organized for our college students by the department of Botany in collaboration with Horticulture Training Institute (HTI), Uchani, Karnal on March 21-23, 2023. Total 25 students of our college from different streams attended this workshop along with Botany staff members. On first day of this three day training, our students visited the esteemed institute. Dr. Joginder, Joint Director Horticulture cum Principal, HTI inaugurated the session. He addressed the participants and motivated them to explore new career options in the field of Horticulture. He emphasized that skill based knowledge can help them in increasing livelihood as a reliable source of income. Later Dr. O.P. Ahlawat, Principal Scientist, ICAR-IIWBR, Karnal delivered enlightening talks on 'Introduction and Scope of Mushroom Cultivation in Haryana' and 'Nutritional and Medicinal Value of Mushroom'. During evening session, Dr. R. S. Taya, SES (Plant Pathology) Retd., KVK, Damla, Yamunanagar delivered very informative talks on

'Preparation of Compost by Short and Long Method' and 'Spawn, Spawning and Different Strains' in Mushroom production Technology. During second day, participants visited Regional Mushroom Research Centre, Murthal, Sonepat (MHU, Karnal) for the practical exposure of Mushroom production process and their post-harvest management, from entrepreneurship view point. During evening session of day 2 at HTI, Dr. R. S. Taya threw light upon 'Preparation of Casing material and Casing Process' along with 'Picking and Packing of Mushroom'. He also shared his personal experiences and several issues practically faced during mushroom cultivation. On third day of this training, Dr. R. S. Taya delivered his talk on 'Production Technology of Oyster Mushroom' and 'Production Technology of Shittake Mushroom'. Evening session was concluded by a very informative talk by Dr. R. S. Taya on 'Abiotic and Biotic Factors Affecting Mushroom Cultivation and their Management' followed by the Valedictory function. College principal respected Dr. Meenu Sharma congratulated the participants upon successful completion of the training workshop.
